Netiquette: Forwards

It is important to use good manners when forwarding e-mails. Now and again, we all see an interesting message that we might want to share with friends, so we forward it along.

However, other folks practice mass-forwarding. They forward every joke, prayer chain, political e-mail, funny image, urban legend or anything else they can get their hands to everyone they know, including people who are business contacts. That many messages can clog up already full inboxes. It also makes people less likely to notice an actual important e-mail from you. Always avoid sending items like forwards to your friends' work e-mail addresses. Some examples of emails that should be forwarded using caution are:

Fwd: FW: THE CREEPY \$20 BILL
Fwd: FW: Visit with God - Forwarded mes
Fwd: FW: Riddle for seniors Subject: I
Fwd: FW: MAGNIFICENT!! - Forwarded me
Fwd: Read, heed and forward This will c
Fwd: The Irish Furniture Dealer - Begin fo

Fwd: Fw: Fwd: Six trivia questions. How

Think back to the days of phone calls and letters. You might call someone up or write them a letter if you saw something interesting, but would you make seven separate phone calls in a day or write seven letters?

One way to be sure you aren't bombarding your friends is to ask if they want to receive fun forwards or not. But don't be offended if they say they don't have the time. Or consider combining the information into one e-mail featuring the best things you've seen recently. That takes a little copying and pasting, but a lot of folks actually do that. It's a convenient way for friends to enjoy things you want to share.

Another considerate thing to do is not to use a "send all" function or go down and select everyone on your list of contacts.

Think carefully about whether or not the person will really be interested. This is also where you can make specific lists of folks to receive jokes or political e-mails after you check with them to see if they are interested.

Social media, such as Facebook, is a great outlet for sharing news stories and jokes. There's less likelihood of some type of important communication getting buried in a pile or forwards and it was specifically designed for sharing that type of information.

From Judy – Don't forget to delete all addresses before forwarding any 'message' on your joke, etc. email list. If you receive a forwarded joke, etc. with a gazillion e-mail addresses, please let the sender know they should delete all of the addresses before forwarding the message. Tell them Homeland Security, their police department, etc. appreciates them doing that to help reduce people harvesting all of the e-mail addresses and using them for phishing e-mails. They should put the addresses in the Bcc: field.

The Windows Malicious Software Removal Tool has been updated for WannaCry Defensive Computing By Michael Horowitz, Computerworld | May 26, 2017 12:07 PM PT

Microsoft offers a number of free anti-malware tools. Windows 10 and 8.1 users have <u>Windows</u> <u>Defender</u>. Windows 7 users can chose between the full-featured <u>Microsoft Security Essentials (MSE)</u> or the limited <u>Windows Defender</u>. But all Windows users have access to the <u>Malicious Software Removal Tool (MSRT)</u> even though they may not be aware of it.

MSRT is part of the monthly patch Tuesday bug fixes. Windows Update downloads a new version of MSRT and runs a scan with it as part of its normal processing. The last patch Tuesday was May 9th and Microsoft dutifully issued a new version of MSRT.

I mention this because on May 23rd someone contacted me to ask why MSRT had just been updated. He had seen a new version appear in Windows Update on a 32 bit Windows 7 machine that had been dutifully updated on the 9th.

Review your update history

Check the Status column to ensure all important updates were successful. To remove an update, see <u>Installed Updates</u>. Troubleshoot problems with installing updates

Windows Update installed MSRT on May 21st and then again on May 25th

I checked a 64 bit Windows 7 machine that had been updated on the 21st. Sure enough, running Windows Update on the 25th, installed a new version of the software (shown above).

The May 9th release was version 5.48.13801, the May 22nd edition is version 5.48.13803. The May 9th edition is 149MB (156,335,152 bytes), the May 22nd version is 126MB (132,223,576 bytes).

What changed? Initially, Microsoft didn't say, the home page for MSRT, had not been updated as of the 25th.

However, when asked, a company representative said that the May 22nd update was "to detect and remove <u>WannaCrypt</u> malware." WannaCrypt is another name for <u>WannaCry</u>.

You can run MSRT manually by simply typing "<u>MRT" into the Run box</u>. Or, you can find it at C:\Windows\system32\MRT.exe

When you run it manually, the initial window has a link to "View a list of malicious software that this tool detects and removes." The May 22nd version includes Win32/WannaCrypt in this list, the May 9th version does not.

Running it manually offers the option of a <u>Full scan</u>. When its run as part of Windows Update, it only does a Quick scan.

MSRT can be downloaded at any time from here. The <u>32bit edition is currently Windows-KB890830-</u> <u>V5.48.exe</u>, the <u>64 bit edition is Windows-KB890830-x64-V5.48.exe</u>.

A nice thing about MSRT is that it's portable. You make a copy of MRT.exe on a non-infected PC, rename it to SomethingElse.exe for good luck, and run a full scan with it on an infected machine. Can't hurt.



More Information About Time Machine

Time Machine is used for backup by many (most?) people using Apple computers. However, that application provides rather sparse information about what's going on. Want more information? Open the Console, which is in either the Applications or Utilities folder, depending on the version of OS X. The right three columns will display processes that have been run. The Time Machine process is called "backupd". Key "backupd" (no quotes) in the search box of Console, then start up Time Machine, noting the time in the Menu bar so you can view the processes for that specific instance of backupd. In Figure 1 are shown the processes associated with Time Machine for a specific manual backup starting at 1:57:27 pm. It takes some experience to comprehend the displayed information. However, with experience you will gain the ability to know when something is amiss even if you don't understand all information provided—and that is valuable.

Apple's New File System

Next year, or perhaps sooner, we can expect a new proprietary file system for Apple computers. It's called APFS (Apple File System) and will replace the current HFS+ file system. HFS+ was introduced by Apple in January 1998 as a replacement for HFS (Hierarchical File System), which came along in September 1985. APFS will be used by <u>macOS, tvOS, iOS and watchOS</u>. It is designed for SSD and flash storage. It is crash-protected and HFS+/HFS compatible. Apple will provide an in-place HFS+ to APFS converter so that HFS+ devices will not have to be reformatted. OS X Yosemite and earlier versions of the operating system will not be able to use APFS. APFS will be available, and be the default file system, in 2017. Presumably MS-DOS (FAT) formatted disks will still be readable by both Apple and Windows machines.

Musings of an Apple Tyro

Full System Restore:

Have you ever done a full system restore on your computer? I haven't had to do this for years, including our use of PC/Windows machines. However... on July 17th it became necessary to do so on our MacBook Pro.

After deleting ~60 GB of files from the MacBook, I discovered none of the space occupied by these files was recovered. Running Disk Utility I discovered numerous file errors on the internal hard drive (actually a solid state drive) with Disk Utility displaying the final message shown in Figure 1#. Can you feel the tension rising?





At this point I contacted Apple via <u>https://getsupport.apple.com/</u> and soon was talking with a support techie who connected to my computer and watched me run Disk Utility again and then said "It would be best to delete everything from your hard drive and do a full system restore from Time Machine. Do you have Time Machine backups?" "Yes", was my response. This was now sweaty palm time. Wipe the drive clean? Really? The techie walked me through the procedure step-by-step. The process is quite simple#: (a) plug in the external Time Machine disk drive, (b) boot up the computer in "Recover Mode" (turn on the power while holding down the Command and "R" keys), (c) select "Restore from Time Machine Backup" and follow the well-described procedures, (d) wait about an hour, and (e) login. Subsequently everything was back to normal, disk capacity reflected the deletion of 60 GB of files, no file errors, and no lost data#. All was well. Support from Apple was excellent, including a follow-up phone call to ask "is all now okay?"

- 1 Running Disk Utility again would only confirm that there are disk errors. Another choice in running Recovery HD is to recover everything from Time Machine backup, which in doing reformats or deletes everything on the troubled disk.
- 2 A few details are omitted here, but the process is truly straightforward. See <u>http://bit.ly/1JNPiAz</u> for an article entitled "Bug in latest version of OS X gives attackers unfettered root privileges". This article describes a bug in OS X Yosemite (versions 10.10.4 and 10.10.5 [beta]) that makes it possible to infect Macs with rootkits and other types of persistent malware. Version 10.11 (El Capitan in beta) is free of the flaw. To quote from this report "The typical scenario where these types of vulnerabilities are exploited is by developers of malicious applications who want to elevate privileges without prompting end users to enter a system password or by

developers of remote exploits that on their own can execute malicious code as a regular user but not as root."

The original disclosure was made by Stefan Esser at <u>http://bit.ly/1MsQYEt</u> on July 7, 2015. Apple apparently is not going to fix the problem in Yosemite; see <u>http://yhoo.it/1MsR0wj</u>. It would seem anti-malware software will not protect users against this flaw.

There seem to be three solutions to the problem:

- ♦ Install SUIDGuard from <u>http://bit.ly/16Gbe1</u> or <u>https://github.com/sektioneins/SUIDGuard</u>. This fix is probably beyond the capabilities of most Mac users.
- Upgrade to OS X El Capitan beta now.
- Wait until El Capitan becomes available for general distribution and install this operating system.
 El Capitan may be available about the time you read this.

Checking Wi-Fi Networks:

From time to time you may want to check the wireless networks your computer has accessed and keeps track of for future access. If you travel quite a bit you can accumulate an astonishing number of Wi-Fi sites you've used, many of which you will probably never access again. To see this information:

- 1. Select Apple from the Menu.
- 2. Click on System Preferences.
- 3. Select Network.
- 4. Click on the padlock in the lower left of the pane and enter your password so that you can make changes. Be careful about the changes you make.
- 5. Click on "Wi-Fi" icon in the left pane of the window.
- 6. Click on the Advanced tab in the lower right of the pane.
- 7. A list of "Preferred Networks" will be displayed. Security information about each network will also be shown. Note, when you computer attempts to access a Wi-Fi site it will start from the top of the list.

To delete a Wi-Fi network, highlight an entry and click on the "-" icon. Entries can be manually ordered by "drag and drop". Remember to click OK for the changes to be made.

3 The first backup with Time Machine after this recovery took 14 minutes; normally this process takes 1-2 minutes. Inspection of the System Log showed many occurrences of "Reassociating Snapshot Volume...". Subsequent Time Machine backups ran normally and all previous instances of backup were still present.

When finished it is prudent to click on the padlock icon to prevent unintended changes. See <u>https://support.apple.com/kb/PH18525</u> for information from Apple.

Notes: You can use notes to capture a quick thought, create checklists, sketch ideas and more. You can use notes on your iPhone, iPad, and the iPod Touch.

The sketching feature in notes is only available in IOS 9 or later on the iPhone 5 and later, iPad Pro, iPad 4th generation, all iPad Air models, iPad mini 2 and later and the 6 generation of the iPod Touch.

You can create a note directly in the notes app, or you can ask SIRI to start one for you. In Notes, you can add a title, heading, or a bulleted list directly in your note. You can also add an attachment or add a photo or video.

You can also sketch a note. With the tip of your finger, you can sketch an idea or plan in your note. You can choose from a selection of drawing tools and colors or use a ruler to draw straight lines. If you have an iPad Pro, you can use the Apple Pencil to sketch in notes.

You can also search for a note or attachment. You can search for a specific note from the top of the Notes list by scrolling to the top of the Notes list to reveal the search field, and then entering what you're looking for.

To help keep you organized you can sort your notes by date created, date modified, or alphabetically. You can also store notes in different folders.

You can share notes and also invite others to join you in a note so you can collaborate on things like grocery lists, project notes, travel plans and more. You can secure your notes by creating a password. Then you can use that password to unlock your protected notes.

You can also use iCloud to update your notes across all your devices. You will see your notes on all of your Apple devices that you're signed into with the same Apple ID.


